Society of St. Vincent de Paul Holy Redeemer Conference Emergency Fund

First line of defense against foreclosures, evictions, utility shut offs and delinquent payments. This group serves all of Chatham on a non-sectarian basis (you don't need to be Catholic) and need is the only requirement for assistance. Client assistance usually ranges from \$200-650 and is given without regard to a client's religious affiliation. The only pre-requisites are need and a home visit by volunteers.
